

Witnessing to a world of unbelievers with hope from God's Word!

With all of the pressure from political correctness in our secular society, witnessing to unsaved people around us has seemed increasingly difficult. The fear of not coming across as loving, or possibly a lack of Bible knowledge, has caused Christians to get confused about Scripture's clear commands to continually confess our faith. We need to remember that no greater fulfillment exists than what we experience in leading another person to Christ, especially when you see that person's life change from despair to having hope. As an example of this urgency and for the sake of saving souls around us, Darin has had a couple situations to share recently.

First of all an agnostic man that used to call himself an atheist when Darin's conversations with him began a while ago, asked for some time to talk about things going on in their lives. Darin decided to update him the same way you would tell another believer what God's Word had done in your life lately. You'd think that this person would reject anything he heard from the Bible, but he actually agreed to read from his phone on an internet search the words of Psalm 73:25-26. Darin said basically, "I know you don't believe in God at this point, necessarily, but God has used this Scripture to change my life for the better." The moment the unbeliever heard this, he opened up about the pains in his life. He appreciated so much the chance to talk about how only God can meet our needs, not people around us or the things this world has to offer.

Another unbeliever has let Darin talk with him about the Prodigal Son from Luke 15. This man used to claim Christ, before he rejected God and began practicing homosexuality. In deep talks together, Darin's told him that the real difference between them has to do with him rejecting the Bible and Darin believing it. Amazingly, this man feels so loved and honestly handled that he'll say exactly what he thinks. You would enjoy hearing their conversations, with the Bible represented on the one hand and the most sinful views you could imagine on the other. In all the interactions, a kind understanding to let the other person speak defines everything said. Darin has just sent some pages from a book relating to his sin that could help him come to Christ for the first time or repent as a prodigal son to follow God's Word again. Please pray for both men!
